- 1) INTRODUCTION
 - a) One way we can know that our relationship with Jesus is real is that we have a desire to share our faith with others.
 - b) We're told not merely to keep the faith, but to share it.
 - i) If it is a love worth finding, then it should be a love worth sharing.
 - c) If we're not endeavoring to share our faith, then we're not right with God.
 - i) It does not matter how eloquently you preach, nor how beautifully you sing, nor how generously you give, nor how faithfully you attend, nor how circumspectly you walk; there is no substitute for sharing your faith with others.
 - d) Psalm 126:5-6
 - i) If we go and sow, weep and reap, we will understand the secret of sharing our faith.
 - e) Proverbs 11:30
 - f) Why is winning souls wise?
 - i) Because of the value of the soul.
 - (1) Mark 8:36-37
 - (a) Jesus equates one soul as more valuable than the whole world.
 - (2) Why is a soul so valuable?
 - (a) Because of its desirability.
 - (i) The devil desires your soul.
 - (ii) God desires your soul.
 - (iii)The value of an item is the price someone will pay for it. Jesus paid for our souls with His blood upon the cross.
 - (b) Because a soul is durable.
 - (i) A soul will last for all eternity.
 - (ii) There was a time when you were not; there will never be a time when you will not be.
 - (iii)Your soul will go on endless, dateless, timeless and measureless through all eternity.
 - 1. Even when the stars have faded, your soul will be in existence somewhere.
 - 2. Jesus said that those in Hell are tormented forever and ever and ever.
 - 3. Those in Heaven will be there forever and ever and ever.
 - (iv) Through all the endless age, your soul will be in existence in either Heaven or Hell.
 - (c) Because of a soul's possibility.
 - (i) People living in difficult places are not worthless.
 - 1. Call no man worthless for whom Jesus died.
 - 2. See that soul possibly as a saint.
 - a. The Samaritan woman at the well is a Bible example of this.
 - b. Rahab the harlot is another Biblical example of this.

- (ii) In your person, there are three possibilities:
 - 1. The person you are now,
 - 2. The person you could be for evil if you fail to follow God,
 - 3. The person you may be made like, into the likeness of the Lord Jesus.
- ii) Because of the command of the Savior.
 - (1) Jesus has commanded us to make disciples.
 - (a) If you do not endeavor to share your faith, you are missing a blessing.
 - (2) The Christian who does not share his faith is guilty of high treason against Heaven's King.
 - (3) Matthew 4:19
 - (a) If you are not fishing for men, you are not following Christ, you are not abiding in Christ.
 - (4) John 15:5
 - (a) Are you bearing fruit?
 - (b) Are people coming to know the Lord Jesus through your life?
 - (c) Do you love Jesus?
 - (5) John 14:15
 - (a) Are you keeping His commandments?
- iii) Because of the reward of the soul-winner.
 - (1) To see someone else come to Christ is one of the greatest rewards in life.
 - (2) Winning souls for Jesus will last for all eternity.
- 2) WE MUST BE COMMITTED TO SHARE OUR FAITH
 - a) We must be intentional about sharing our faith.
 - i) It is easier not to do it than to do it.
 - b) It's not enough to try to live a good life and then hope that others will desire to be saved simply by seeing the good life that we live. People are not saved by our lives; they're saved by Jesus' death.
 - i) If we live a good life without letting people know why we live that good life, then we're taking praise under false pretenses.
 - ii) Anything good about us is because of Jesus Christ in us.(1) Unless you share that, you will not be a soul winner.
 - c) Mark 16:15
 - i) In the Greek it literally means, "as you go."
 - d) We need to understand that separation from the world is not isolation from the world.
 - i) Jesus was a friend of sinners.
 - ii) Luke 15:2
 - e) There is not a Scripture in the Bible that tells the unsaved to go to church.
 - i) But there is Scripture after Scripture that tell the church to go to the unsaved.

- 3) WE MUST BE CONCERNED WHEN WE SHARE OUR FAITH
 - a) We should be brokenhearted over the lost.
 - b) Do the things that break the heart of Jesus break yours?
 - c) Luke 13:34
 - i) Jesus wept over Jerusalem.
 - d) Acts 20:31
 - i) Paul wept over the unsaved.
 - e) Jeremiah 9:1
 - i) Jeremiah wept over his people.
 - f) What is wrong with the church today?
 - i) There is no brokenness, no heartache and no tears.
 - ii) We need to see every man as a potential brother; we need to see the lost, not simply theologically and intellectually, but emotionally. We need to see them as God sees them, with a broken heart.
 - iii) Matthew 9:36
 - g) Many claim to be concerned with lost souls, but have family members and neighbors who are Hell-bound because we never shared Jesus with them.
- 4) WE MUST BE CONSISTENT AS WE SHARE OUR FAITH
 - a) Everywhere we go, we share our faith.
 - b) The power of the Word of God is like a seed that can crack open the hardest heart.
 - i) 1 Peter 1:23
 - ii) We need to be consistent in sharing the seed because the seed has power.(1) The Word of God is so powerful.
 - c) We need to recognize the power we hold in our hands with the Bible.
 - i) Hebrews 4:12
 - (1) We need to know it in our heads, stow it in our hearts and sow it in the world.
 - d) The seed that we sow is the Word of God.
 - i) Mark 4:14
 - (1) We need to know the Word of God in our heads, store it in our hearts, and sow it in the world.
 - ii) Psalm 126:6
 - (1) If you want a harvest; the Bible says whatever we sow, we will reap.
 - (2) Sow the Word of God; share what Jesus has done for you.
 - e) The Bible refers to us as witnesses: a lawyer argues his case; a witness tells what he has seen and heard.
- 5) WE MUST BE CONFIDENT IN SHARING OUR FAITH
 - a) Not everyone that you witness to is going to be saved; but some will.
 - b) Mark 4:3-20
 - i) It is God that gives the increase, not us.

- ii) We don't know when someone will get saved or who will get saved. Therefore, we need to keep sharing our faith, scattering the seed.
- c) Someone who says that it does not work, is not trying; it will work.
 - i) Sometimes it takes years for the crop to come to harvest.
- d) There is no greater joy than bringing a lost soul to Jesus Christ.
- e) "must I go in empty-handed, must I meet my Savior so; without one soul with which to greet Him, must I empty-handed go?"
- 6) CONCLUSION
 - a) Do you know Jesus personally? If not, you can pray to Him today by asking Him to come into your life.
 - b) Call upon Jesus today. Repent (turn) from your sins, and turn to Jesus. Ask Him to forgive you of your sins, and acknowledge Him as Lord of your life.
